The Monks ~~ A brief history

More than one year has been traced for the formation of HAMBLE CLUB but it is 1969 that is presently deemed to be correct. Formed as Hamble FC they made steady progress through the Southampton Junior Leagues before merging with a Sunday team, called Hamble Club and adopted their name in 1981. From the senior divisions, Hamble Club were promoted to the Hampshire League in 1993. They moved from their Mount Pleasant base to the Old College Fields and made a further move to what was then known as the Shell-Mex Ground during the 2002/03 season which remains their present home. Wessex members between 2004 and 2007, Hamble became Hampshire Premier League founders but they failed to complete the 2012/13 season and had to start a division lower. But this heralded the start of an upturn as they gained four promotions in five years, including one in their first season back in the Wessex League in 2017.

The club was established in 1969, originally as a youth team. In 1993 they joined Division Three of the Hampshire League. The club were Division Three champions in 1996/97, earning promotion to Division Two. In 2004 the Hampshire League merged into the Wessex League, with Hamble becoming members of the new Division Three. In 2006 the division was renamed Division Two, but at the end of the 2006–07 the division was disbanded and the club became founder members of the Hampshire Premier League.

Hamble pulled out of the Hampshire Premier League during the 2012/13 season. Although they were readmitted the following season, they started in the newly formed second tier of the league, Division One. The club were Division One runners-up in 2013/14 and were promoted to the Senior Division and went on to win the Senior Division in 2014/15. After finishing third the following season they were promoted to Division One and then were Division One champions in 2016/17, earning promotion to the Premier Division.

PORTLAND ~~ The Blues

Nigel Biddlecombe's 'A History of Weymouth FC' mentions 'The Blues' as early as 1902/03 when the club was referred to as Portland and Grove and they were also called that in 1905/06. (In 1904/05 we were just mentioned as Portland.) 1906/07 we were then Portland Prison Officers. In 1910/11 there was reference to Portland Prison Officers and Utd. In 1907/08 a combined team entered the FA Cup under the name 'Portland Prison Officers and Portland United'. They were exempt from the preliminary and 1st qualifying round and were drawn in the 2nd QR to Longfleet St Marys. The game was played on 19 October 1907 in Poole (at Eastlake) and the score was 2 - 2. The replay resulted in a 3 - 1 win for Portland. In the 3rd QR they were drawn at home to Whiteheads losing 0-2 (2nd November 1907). They entered again the following year and in 1909/10. There were then two more seasons when the Prison Officers part of the team did not play. After that, the next entry was after the war when the club reformed in 1921 playing at Grove Corner and in 1925 joined the Western League Div. Although winning this division twice before World War II, the club never achieved promotion to Div one. They regularly played in front of crowds of two and three thousand – a period when they were unbeatable at their Grove Corner ground. During this period, the club won the Dorset Senior Cup on four occasions and the Dorset Amateur Cup three times. Following World War II, the club turned semiprofessional and rejoined Div One of the Western League, where they remained for the next 24 seasons. During this time, the 'Blues' lifted the Dorset Senior Cup a further six times. The record attendance at Grove Corner was set in January 1949 when 4,127 watched the League match against neighbours Weymouth - which Portland won 4 - 1. One of the most successful seasons in the club's history came in 1965/66 when they finished as runners-up in the Western League Div One and progressed to the 4th Qualifying Round of the FA Cup where they held Yeovil Town to a 1 - 1 draw at Grove Corner in front of a crowd of 3,069. In the replay at Huish, in front of 6,005 spectators, The Blues were beaten 3 - 1. In 1994 the Crown decided it needed the original ground for mineral extraction and the club was provided with a new home a couple of hundred yards along the road - hence the name at the time of . . . 'New Grove Corner'! The last game at the ground took place on 9 May 1994, when neighbours Weymouth were the visitors in front of a 500 plus crowd. It was, however, vastly different from the record attendance, on 27 January 1949 when 4,127 saw Portland defeat Weymouth 4 - 1 in a Western League Division One match. During the winter of their first season at the new ground, the entire island of Portland had to be evacuated whilst an unexploded wartime bomb - found underneath the penalty area of their old ground - had to be defused! (To read more, visit: https:// www.dorsetecho.co.uk/news/features/lookingback/18012884.1995-discovery-unexplodedworld-war-two-bomb-portland/.) Although Portland did step up to the Wessex League in 2001, they struggled and returned to the Dorset Premier League in 2006 where they were phenomenally successful League winners: 2007/08, 2008/09, 2012/13 and 2013/14 and runners up in 2014/15. They also won the Dorset Premier League cup in 2008/09 finishing as runners up on three more occasions. Portland's promotion was approved by the Football Association in 2015 (new floodlights were installed) and Portland Utd FC were promoted, much to the delight of everyone connected with The Blues, to The Sydenhams Wessex Football League Division One. The Blues won Division One in their first season, losing just four games in the league, amassing 84 points with a +72-goal difference from 34 games. Portland also reached the semi-final of The Wessex League Cup losing to eventual winners Team Solent in extra time. The Blues also knocked out three other Wessex Premier Division sides on route to the semi-final. Portland Utd FC's programme also received the Programme of the Season Award. The start to the 2016/17 season in the Prem Div saw Portland Utd FC win six, lose two and draw 2 - everyone supporting The Blues were looking forward to hopefully ending up in the top ten at the end of the season. However, following an unbeaten league run of 27 league games, Portland Utd FC had everything to play for in their last match home v Bemerton Heath Harlequins - needing all three points to have a chance of winning the league. With the game at 1 - 1 at 90 minutes it looked like The Blues would have to settle for second place - but a 95th minute goal from Ryan McKechnie saw the Blues clinch victory achieving a remarkable first season in the Prem Div under Manager, Gary Bailey. Portland Utd FC's once again received the Programme of the Season Award and Portland also topped the highest average attendance table. Four years of overseeing The Blues, Manager, Gary Bailey, made the decision in the beginning of May 2017 to step down. In those four years, Gary's squads had been league champions three times and runners-up on the other occasion. Simon Browne (former Manager of Dorchester Res, Salisbury Res, Hamworthy Utd and Wimborne Town FC) was appointed to take on Gary's role. The 2017/18 season saw mixed results for the First Team and following some disappointing results, it was decided to relieve Simon of his duties with Gary Bailey stepping up as Interim Manager at the beginning of February. The Blues ended up in 15th place; although the attendance had dropped slightly, Portland were still 2nd in the league attendance table. For the third year running, Portland received the Programme of the Season Award for the Premier Div. Gary Bailey also picked up an award for Outstanding Contribution as a Manager in Dorset at The Dorset County Football Association Awards 2018. At the end of the season, Gary decided that with work commitments, he would not be able to continue as Manager of the First Team but joined the committee. 2018/19 Brendon King was appointed manager with Mark (Reggie) Carter as his assistant and Stuart Heath as coach. The Blues reached the final of The Sydenhams Wessex League Cup v Baffins Milton Rovers. The only goal was scored in injury time and that was by Baffins. Portland ended up 4th in the table. At The Sydenhams Wessex League Presentation Evening, for the fourth year running Portland Utd FC were award the Programme of the Season Cup. 2019/20 proved to be very eventful for everyone at the club. Our main highlight was our 2nd QR of the Emirates FA Cup home v Salisbury when we had an incredible day losing 0 – 1 in front of just under 600 supporters. A fantastic memory can be found at: https:// dbauckham.exposure.co/out-on-a-limb. Off the pitch, it proved to be a phenomenally successful year; faced with the prospect of either seeing out the remaining time on our lease from The Crown or purchasing the ground for £55,000. The ground is now owned by Portland United FC and will remain as a sporting facility for ever. At the end of the season, Chairman, Robin Satherley, stepped down. Also stepping down was 1st team Manager, Brendon King. 2020/21: After a brief period in charge Callum Brooks (the newly appointed Manager) stepped down and Franklyn Clarke was appointed with Sam Poole as his assistant. For the second season running Covid put paid to football. 2021/22: Portland Utd FC's centenary year! Pre-season was busy with the appointment of Matt Lucas as Chairman, Robin Satherley became the Club's first ever Club Ambassador, the appointment of a Commercial Manager - Vic Holland and the addition of an U18 team to play in the Dorset Football League. The U18s came second in Div West, the Reserves 11th in the DPL and the 1st Team came 15th. Portland won the Programme of the Year and was also named as the 2nd best in Non-League Football in the UK out of 633 entrants. Towards the end of the season our committee grew stronger with the addition of Dave Wilson, Paul Knight, and Reggie Carter. After fifteen years Darren Whyton relinquished his groundsman's post and Randle stepped back from his secretarial duties; a position he had held for eight years. Both Darren and Randle remain on the committee. We welcomed Dave Ring as our new secretary. The end of the centenary season saw Portland Old Boys host a team of ExSaints (including Matt Le Tissier). Over 800 watched and contributed to the £8,800 raised for charity. 2022/23: Our Manager, Franklyn Clarke dropped a bombshell and resigned mid-January leaving the club at 16th on the league table. The newly appointed First Team Manager, Kyle Critchell, and his assistant, Jamie Symes, took over the reins at the end of January and in the remaining fifteen league games recorded eight wins and two draws which resulted in Portland Utd ending up 11th. Phase 1 of our extension of our club house was completed just before Xmas. Once again, we hosted an Ex-Saints team and were able to donate £7,500 to three charities including local charity, The Three Ells Trust. Our Reserves came 13th/17 whilst our U18s did well in their first ever FA Youth Cup winning v Brockenhurst and Christchurch before being knocked out by Horndean. Again, Portland won the Wessex Programme of the Year and this time the programme was named as the best in Non-League Football in the UK out of 635 entrants.

TAMWORTH's heroics aside, the most romantic story of FA Cup third round weekend was one which never actually materialised.

In 154 years of the competition, no father and son have ever played against each other, so when Premier League Everton pulled Peterborough United out of the hat, all talk was of the possibility of Everton full-back Ashley Young facing his 18-year-old son Tyler.

Tyler was named on the Posh bench but, in the end, a tight game at Goodison Park meant that Peterborough boss Darren Ferguson had to put the needs of his team before the purists and the young midfielder didn't get on. And in another twist to the tale, Ashley's brother, and Tyler's uncle, Lewis Young took charge of only his second game as caretaker manager, leading out Dagenham & Redbridge at Millwall on Monday night.

Despite not quite etching their names in cup folklore, it proved a memorable weekend for the Young family – one to tell the grandchildren one day.

"It was fantastic to be there [at Everton] on Thursday night," Lewis told The NLP. It was a dream for me and the whole family all dotted around.

"We probably ended up making it nearly a sell out because the amount of us went up."

Ask any footballer of a certain age and they'll tell you it's every player's dream to see their son or daughter make their own way in the game – better still playing alongside them.

And that was the case for two former full-time stalwarts who lined up alongside their sons in Non-League last week.

Ronnie Henry says he has fulfilled the final ambition of his 23-year playing career after playing alongside son Louie for Potters Bar.

Stevenage legend Henry, 41, joined the Scholars in June after watching 17-year-old Louie play at the Lantern on loan from his former club last season.

The centre-back even admitted that the possibility of left-back Louie returning to the Isthmian Premier division side had convinced him not to hang up his boots.

Henry was made to sweat, with talk of loan moves elsewhere, but the deal was completed last week and on Tuesday night the pair lined up in Max Mitchell's back four, helping the Scholars to a 2-1 win at Canvey Island. "I've achieved quite a few things in my career, but playing alongside Louie is right up there with any of them," Henry, who won two FA Trophies, a Conference title and the League Two play-offs during two glittering spells at the Lamex, told The NLP.

"When I decided to play on for another year, it did depend on what Louie was going to do. And at times it looked like he would go elsewhere. So for him to come to Potters Bar and for me to play alongside him was a special, special moment.

"It's a moment that I didn't think was ever going to happen. I didn't even dream of it happening, to be honest. Even driving to the game, I thought 'This is surreal'. But when we crossed that white line, everything just felt really natural.

"It was a fantastic experience and it almost feels like 'OK, I've achieved everything I could have hoped for in football now'."

Someone who knows exactly how Henry is feeling right now is Danny Kedwell.

The Ashford United player/manager says it's an "amazing feeling" to partner his son in the Nuts & Bolts front line in the Isthmian South East division – even though he'd really rather not to!

Kedwell has been forced to dust down his predatory scoring boots in recent weeks at the age of 41 to cover an injury and suspension crisis at the Homelands, which has propelled his 16-year-old schoolboy son Preston into the spotlight having netted three goals in his first six starts in senior football.

"He's only 16, he's still at school, so to get experience of men's football at his age is fantastic," said Kedwell Snr, who scored over 250 career goals for the likes of AFC Wimbledon, Gillingham and Ebbsfleet United.

"In all my footballing career, I never thought I would ever be playing alongside my son.

"It's an amazing feeling, albeit unexpected because I don't really want to be playing at 41 to be honest! But with all the injuries and suspensions we've had, I had no choice.

"I was buzzing for him, because it's hard for him being 16 years of age and the manager's son.

"It's an easy option not to play him but he doesn't deserve that. He's had six starts this season and got three goals. As a manager, if I think you are good enough to play then you'll play, and I'll treat you the same as anyone else.

"When it comes to matchday, he's just a normal player. He's deserved his start like anyone else. He's been patient and every time he's come on he's done really well."
